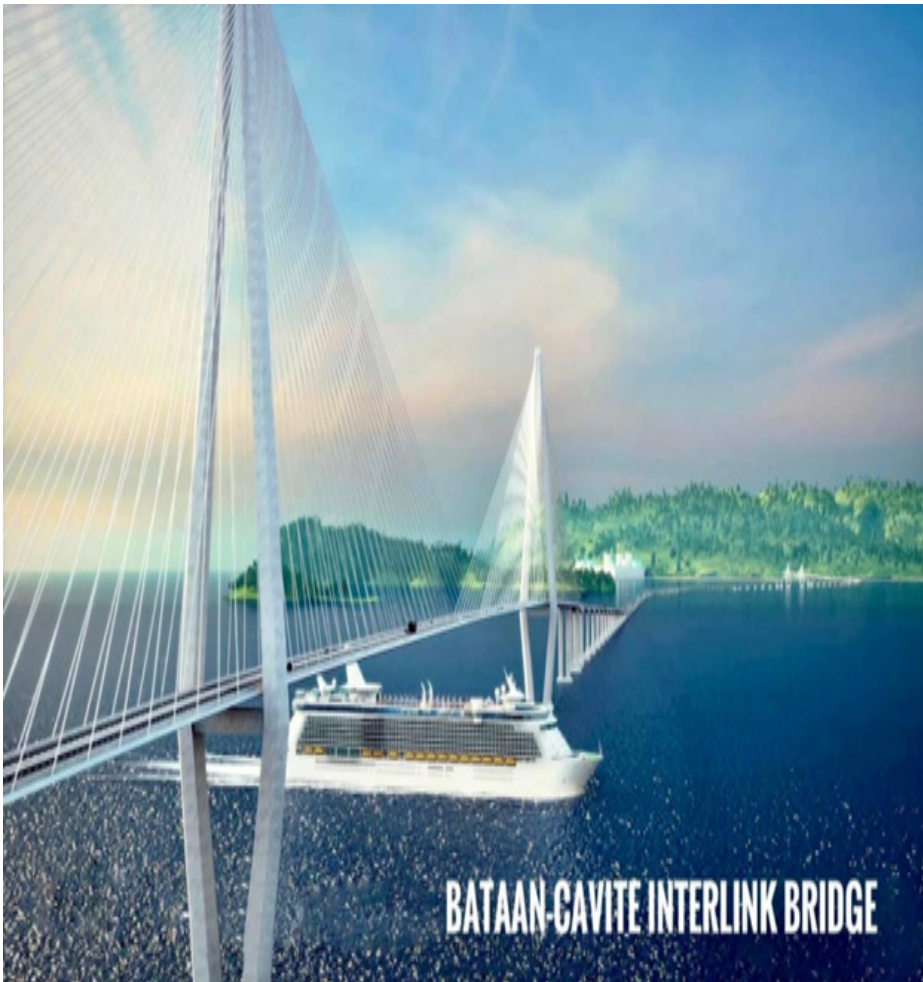

BRINGING HEALTHCARE CLOSER: MEDICAL AND DENTAL MISSION HELD IN BRGY.SAN RAFAEL II NOVELETA



With the goal of promoting community wellness and preventive care, a medical and dental mission was successfully conducted in Barangay San Rafael II, Noveleta on July 29, 2025, serving a total of 387 beneficiaries.

The activity was made possible through the collaborative efforts of the Provincial Government of Cavite through the Medical Mission Team of the Office of the Governor and the Office of the Provincial Health Officer, and the local government of Noveleta. A range of free healthcare services were provided, including medical and dental consultations, X-ray examinations, and blood sugar testing.

The health mission was warmly welcomed by the residents, who took the opportunity to consult with medical professionals and avail of basic diagnostic services, especially those who rarely have access to routine check-ups.

Gracing the event were Noveleta Mayor Davey Chua, Cavite 1st District Board Member Romel Enriquez, and Board Member Juan Ismael Gandia, who expressed their appreciation to the medical team for bringing essential services closer to the community.

**CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA)** — President Ferdinand Marcos, Jr. said construction of the 32 kilometer Bataan-Cavite interlink bridge – touted to be the country's longest bridge once completed – will begin before 2025 ends.

“Bago matapos ang taon, magsisimula na ang Bataan-Cavite Interlink Bridge. Ang tulay na ito ay 32 kilometro ang haba at tumatawid sa Manila Bay. Kung ang biyahe ngayon mula Mariveles hanggang Naic ay umaabot ng limang oras, balang araw ito ay magiging 45 minuto na lamang,” the President said in his fourth State of the Nation Address (SONA) yesterday.

The 32.15-kilometer, four-lane, inter-island bridge will connect Brgy. Alas-asin in Mariveles, Bataan, to Brgy. Timalan Concepcion in Naic, Cavite.

It is expected to shorten travel time and generate economic opportunities in Bataan, Cavite, and neighboring provinces by improving access and connectivity.

The project is primarily funded through Official Development Assistance (ODA) loans from the Asian Development Bank (ADB),

with co-financing from the Asian Infrastructure Investment Bank (AIIB). President Marcos also announced the partial opening next year of the South Luzon Expressway Toll Road 4 (SLEX TR4), which spans from Sto. Tomas City in Batangas to Tiaong, Quezon.

The President directed the Department of Transportation (DOTr) and the Department of Public Works and Highways (DPWH) to ensure strict monitoring of the ongoing projects to guarantee high-quality construction and timely completion.

“Sa 2026, inaasahang magbubukas na sa motorista ang bahagi ng extension ng SLEX mula Sto. Tomas, Batanga hanggang Tiaong, Quezon. Kapag natapos itong buong proyekto ang dating apat na oras na biyahe, magiging isang oras na lang,” President Marcos said.

“Kaya inatasan ko na ang DOTr at DPWH na bantayang mabuti ang mga proyekto sa kahabaan ng Quezon patulak ng Bicol at tiyaking tama ang kalidad, matibay, at nasa takdang oras ang pagtatapos,” the President added.

The SLEX TR4 is a 67-kilometer toll road that will connect the provinces of Batangas, Laguna, and Quezon, reducing current travel time from four hours to just one.

## FIREARMS SEIZED IN SEARCH WARRANT OPERATION; SUSPECT ARRESTED IN MENDEZ, CAVITE

– Personnel of the Mendez Municipal Police Station, under the supervision of PMAJ IAN JASPER M MONTOYA, Acting Chief of Police, successfully implemented a search warrant operation that led to the arrest of a suspect for illegal possession of firearms at around 8:05 PM on July 30, 2025 in Brgy. Asis 3, Mendez, Cavite.

The subject of the operation was identified as alias ARILD and resident of Brgy. Asis 3, Mendez, Cavite. He was arrested for violation of Republic Act No. 10591, also known as the Comprehensive Firearms and Ammunition Regulation Act.

The search was carried out by virtue of Search Warrant issued on the same date by RTC Branch 132, Naic, Cavite. The operation was conducted in the presence of the required barangay officials. The said operation is recorded using Body-Worn Cameras (BWCs) and Alternative Recording

Devices (ARDs) to ensure transparency.

Recovered during the operation were the following items: one (1) unit Colt Automatic Cal. .45 pistol; one (1) unit Cal. .357 revolver (unknown make/model, no serial number); one (1) magazine for Cal. .45; five (5) live rounds of Cal. .45 ammunition; thirty-five (35) live rounds of Cal. .357 ammunition and three (3) spent shells of Cal. .45. The arrested suspect and confiscated items are now under the custody of Mendez MPS for documentation and proper disposition. A report will be submitted to the court of origin in accordance with legal procedures.

PCOL ARIEL R RED, Acting Provincial Director of Cavite PPO, lauded the swift and coordinated effort of the operating unit and emphasized the PNP's unwavering dedication to enforcing the law, especially in removing unlicensed firearms from communities to ensure public safety and peace.

## REGIONAL MOST WANTED CYBERCRIME OFFENDER CAPTURED IN JOINT POLICE OPERATION

– In a joint law enforcement operation, the Cavite Component City Police Station (Lead Unit) under the supervision of PLTCOL SOCRATES SOLINAP JACA, Officer-in-Charge, in coordination with the San Pedro City Component Police Station and the 401st Regional Mobile Force Battalion, successfully arrested a Regional Level Most Wanted Person at Barangay 10-A, Cavite City at around 2:15 PM on July 30, 2025.

The accused, known by the alias "JOSHUA", a resident of Pasong Kawayan II, General Trias City, Cavite, was apprehended by virtue of a Warrant of Arrest for violation of Section 4(b) (2)(ii) of Republic Act No. 10175 or the Cybercrime Prevention Act of 2012, covering ten (10) criminal cases.

The arrest was made under the authority of the Warrant of Arrest issued by Presiding Judge of Regional Trial Court

Branch 31, Fourth Judicial Region, San Pedro City, Laguna, dated August 20, 2024, with a recommended bail of Php120,000.00 for each count.

The operation was conducted in accordance with legal protocols and with the use of Body-Worn Cameras and Alternative Recording Devices to ensure transparency and adherence to procedural standards.

The arrested individual was properly documented and temporarily placed under the custody of the Cavite Component City Police Station for booking and processing. Following standard legal procedures, the case will be returned to the court of origin for further judicial proceedings, including arraignment and trial. The arresting unit will ensure the timely turnover of all necessary documents and coordinate with the court regarding the next steps of the case.

**CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA)** – Naibalik na sa kulungan ang walo sa sampung Persons Deprived of Liberty (PDL) na nakatakas mula sa Batangas Provincial Rehabilitation Center sa Ibaan, Batangas kahapon, July 28.

Ayon sa Philippine National Police, nakatakas ang mga PDL bandang 9:30 ng umaga sa pamamagitan ng pagtutok ng ice pick ng isang preso sa isang prison guard na nagdulot ng kalituhan at tuluyang pagtakas ng siyam na preso. Agad nagsagawa ng hot pursuit operation ang Santo Tomas at Ibaan Police Station upang habulin ang mga preso.

Nilinaw ni Lt. Col. Marlon Cabataña, Chief of Police ng Sto. Tomas PNP, na hindi hostage-taking ang naganap na insidente sa Batangas.

Ayon sa kapulisan, sumakay ng pampasaherong bus ang limang preso at nagpanggap din bilang pasahero upang tumakas at makalayo sa lugar subalit agad ding nahuli sa STAR Tollway sa boundary ng Tanauan City at Sto. Tomas City sa Batangas. Bagamat umabot ng halos 30 minuto ang pakikipag-uusap sa mga preso bago tuluyang napasuko ng pulisya, wala naman naiulat na sinaktan o nasaktang mga pasahero sa nasabing insidente.

“Gusto lang makausap ang pamilya, hindi naman daw sila lalaban, ang ginawa po namin para makasiguro na wala silang armas ay kinumbinse po natin sila na ilabas yung baril, pinalagay namin sa isang bag ng pasahero, nung ma-confirm namin na yun nan ga yung baril na hawak nila, in a safe distance ay nagkaroon po kami ng pag-uusap,” pahayag ni Cabataña.

Pinahubad lang anila ang mga damit pang-itaas upang masiguro na wala

nang armas na itinatago ang mga tumakas na preso.

Nakuha sa mga preso ang isang 9mm Llama pistol, mga bala, magazine, balisong, ilang piraso ng susi at pera na nagkakahalaga ng P59,673.

Sa kasalukuyan, nasa kustodiya na ng mga kapulisan ang limang preso habang ang tatlo pang preso na tumakas din ay nahuli naman kaagad sa Sitio Buro, Barangay Coliat, Ibaan, Batangas matapos ang isinagawang hot pursuit operation ng kapulisan.

Nanawagan naman si Police Regional Office 4A, Police Brigadier General Jack L Wanky sa publiko na ipagbigay alam sa mga awtoridad kung may mga kahina-hinalang tao sa kanilang lugar habang tinutugis pa ng pulisya ang dalawa pang pugante na nakatakas.

## GOVERNMENT AID FOR WEST PHILIPPINE SEA FISHERFOLK CONTINUES

**LOS BAÑOS, Laguna (PIA)** — Fishing communities affected by the ongoing tension in the West Philippine Sea (WPS) continue to receive livelihood support from the government.

Sammy Malvas, Regional Director of the Department of Agriculture's Bureau of Fisheries and Aquatic Resources (BFAR) IV-A, said local fisherfolk are incurring higher production costs as they are forced to avoid areas in the West Philippine Sea where tensions remain high.

“Here in CALABARZON, although we are not facing the West Philippine Sea directly, we still have fishermen who go there. They are among those affected by the tension [in the area].”

In 2021, the DA-BFAR Fisherfolk Registration System (FishR) reported that an estimated 66,842 CALABARZON fisherfolk venture at the West Philippine Sea. They comprise 21 percent of the 318,297 Filipinos whose livelihoods rely on these waters. However, continuous tensions caused production from regional fisherfolk to dwindle by six to seven percent in 2024.

“We cannot blame them [the fisherfolk] if they choose to find other areas to fish and have to go far. And because they had to fish farther, so did their operation costs.”

Malvas said some fisherfolk reported shelling out up to Php 100,000 in operation costs, which previously could only reach Php 8,000.00.

In his 2024 State of the nation Address (SONA),

President Ferdinand Marcos Jr. reaffirmed the government's commitment to safeguarding the country's sovereignty over the West Philippine Sea. Citing laws on Maritime Zones and Archipelagic Sea Lanes, the President outlined a strategy that focuses on ingraining the sense of ownership among Filipinos through education and information campaigns.

That same year, BFAR launched the LAYAG-WPS, or Livelihood Activities to Enhance Fisheries Yields and Economic Gains from the West Philippine Sea, to provide fishing communities facing the WPS with livelihood opportunities related to fisheries.

“Through this latest initiative [LAYAG-WPS], we provide livelihood assistance and fuel assistance. We also deploy vessels to collect our fisherfolk's catch, so they will not need to go to the port. Our food boat will go directly to these fishing vessels, saving their operation costs by almost half.”

BFAR also provides the affected fisherfolk with fuel assistance to support their food boat initiative. While providing alternative livelihood and market access for local fisherfolk remains crucial, BFAR remains steadfast in reminding Filipino fisherfolk of their rightful claim to the West Philippine Sea.

“We always remind our fisherfolk, and our kababayans, that the West Philippine Sea is ours. Our presence should always be felt in this area.” (PB/PIA 4A) **BY PATRICIA BERMUDEZ**

## GATCHALIAN, AQUINO COMMEND PBBM PUSH TO PRIORITIZE EDUCATION REFORMS

**MANILA** — Senators Sherwin Gatchalian and Bam Aquino on Monday welcomed President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s renewed commitment to prioritize education reforms, describing it as a major step toward addressing learning system gaps.

Gatchalian said the President's remarks during his fourth State of the Nation Address (SONA) highlighted the need to strengthen foundational education and ensure the full implementation of existing laws.

"Nakita ko kanina sa SONA speech ni Presidente na malaking time ang dinevote niya sa education na dapat palakasin, ayusin ang senior high school, iimplement yung mga batas na naipasa natin lalo na yung ARAL law, ECCD law (I saw that the President devoted significant time in his SONA to education, emphasizing the need to strengthen it, fix senior high school, and implement the laws we've passed, especially the ARAL law and ECCD law)," Gatchalian said in an interview.

Aquino, chairperson of the Senate Committee on Basic Education, said he would ensure that the promised reforms are carried out.

"Natutuwa kami na gagawing priority ang education for the next 3 years (We are glad that education will be a priority for the next three years)," Aquino said.

"Sisiguraduhin natin na ang mga repormang ito masasagawa at babantayan natin yung mga pangakong ito—yung mga napangako sa mga classrooms, connectivity, tulong sa mga guro natin—iisahin po natin yan at sisiguraduhin nating naipatupad (We will make sure these reforms are implemented and the promises—on classrooms, connectivity, and support for teachers—are fulfilled)," he added.

Both senators said sustained collaboration between the executive and legislative branches would be crucial in ensuring that long-delayed education reforms are institutionalized.

In his SONA, Marcos reaffirmed that education remains a top priority of his administration, citing a series of ongoing reforms to address learning gaps, improve teacher welfare, and strengthen foundational learning.

He highlighted the implementation of the Academic Recovery and Accessible Learning (ARAL) Program and the expansion of Early Childhood Care and Development (ECCD) initiatives—both anchored on laws passed by Congress.

He also committed to the construction of over 300 Barangay Child Development Centers and Bulilit Centers, with a PHP1-billion initial funding, to address the backlog in daycare facilities dating back to the 1990s.

To support the mental and physical well-being of students and teachers, Marcos launched the YAKAP Caravan, offering free medical checkups, laboratory tests, and medicines.

He likewise vowed to hire more school counselors to address mental health concerns and announced accelerated efforts to complete children's routine vaccinations.

On infrastructure, the President reported the opening of 22,000 classrooms over three years and vowed to build 40,000 more with support from Congress and the private sector.

He also assured proper procurement of laptops, digital tools, and connectivity support for teachers and students.

For educators, Marcos pledged compensation for teaching overloads and overtime, as well as streamlined paperwork

## DOT TO TARGET 'GLOBALLY COMPETITIVE, JOB-GENERATING' TOURISM: FRASCO

**MANILA** — The Department of Tourism (DOT) will focus on building a "globally competitive" tourism industry that generates more jobs for Filipinos, Tourism Secretary Christina Frasco said Monday.

She made the reaffirmation in response to President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s directive to boost efforts to bring jobs to the four percent of Filipinos who remain unemployed.

## DBM: GOV'T TO DOUBLE TEACHER HIRING TO CUT BACKLOG

**MANILA** — The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) on Tuesday said it would double the creation of new teaching positions in 2026 to address the persistent shortage of educators in public schools.

In a post-State of the Nation Address (SONA) briefing, Budget Secretary Amenah Pangandaman said the government has created a total of 60,000 new teaching positions and some 5,000 non-teaching posts to relieve teachers of their administrative work.

"Sa administrasyon po ni Pangulong Bongbong Marcos Jr., sisikapin po natin na matapos yung backlog na 'yan... Sa susunod na taon dodoblehin natin 'yan (Under President Bongbong Marcos Jr.'s administration, we will strive to eliminate that backlog... Next year, we will double it)," Pangandaman said.

The Budget chief said the increase would also include the hiring of more guidance counselors to

strengthen student support services.

The hiring of new educators is part of the Marcos administration's broader push to improve the quality of education through better teacher-to-student ratios and support systems.

The Education Commission 2 (EDCOM II), which is tasked with studying reforms in the education sector, has also flagged teacher shortages as a key barrier to effective learning.

In his fourth SONA on Monday, Marcos said teachers remain at the heart of the education system as he vowed that starting this school year, public school teachers will receive payment for teaching overload and overtime hours.

He also touted the reduced administrative tasks of teachers under his leadership.

The DepEd earlier reported that teachers' workload was cut by 57 percent.

To further reduce

53,356 metric tons (MT), amounting to PHP2.34 billion due to the combined effects of the enhanced southwest monsoon and tropical cyclones Emong (international name Co-May), Dante (Francisco), and Crising (Wipha).

As of July 25, the prevailing prices of bitter melon rose to PHP140 per kg., higher than PHP127 on July 21; string beans, up to PHP120 per kg. from PHP114 per kg.; pechay tagalog, now at PHP100 per kg. from PHP88; squash, PHP60 per kg. from PHP51; eggplant, PHP140 per kg. from PHP123.86 per kg.; bell pepper, PHP200 per kg. from PHP192.18 per kg.; and cabbage, now up to PHP80 per kg., from 74.22 per kg., among others, according to the DA-Bantay Presyo (price watch).

## MARCOS: WORLD BANK TO BOOST PH AGENDA ON HEALTH, JOBS, RESILIENCE

**MANILA** — President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. on Tuesday hailed the launch of the World Bank Group's Country Partnership Framework (CPF) for the Philippines for fiscal years 2025 to 2031, saying it would help bring the government's development agenda closer to ordinary Filipinos through targeted investments in health, education, job creation, and disaster resilience.

Speaking at the ceremonial turnover of the CPF at the Malacañan Palace in Manila, Marcos said the partnership reflects the priorities he laid out in his fourth State of the Nation Address and aligns with the Philippine Development Plan 2023–2028.

"The Philippines has accomplished much over the past two decades... However, we are well cognizant of the fact that much more needs to be done to ensure that the progress is truly felt by every Filipino, wherever they may be," the President said.

Marcos outlined three major outcome areas supported by the CPF: improving access to quality health care and education, opening more private sector jobs, and strengthening the country's disaster resilience in the face of climate change.

"We are improving the delivery of public health services, especially in underserved areas, including the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao," he added.

He cited the ongoing Phase One of the Philippine Health Systems Resilience Project as a key initiative in building capacity to respond to health emergencies and improving equitable access to care.

"With more equitable health care, we are giving our people not only longer lives, but hope, security,

and dignity," Marcos said.

On education, he stressed the need to address learning gaps and align student skills with market demands.

"We are also focused on addressing students' learning gaps... to ensure that our students will grow into future leaders, innovators and visionaries," he added.

To drive job creation, Marcos said the government will continue simplifying business regulations, enhancing infrastructure, and attracting more investments.

"Binubuksan natin ang mas maraming dekalidad na trabaho sa pribadong sektor (We are opening more quality jobs in the private sector)... By raising every Filipino household's productivity and income, we fuel growth in our key sectors," he said.

He also emphasized the need for climate adaptation and disaster preparedness. "Pinapalakas natin ang kakayahan ng bansa na harapin ang mga sakuna at epekto ng nagbabagong klima (We are strengthening our capacity to face calamities and the effects of climate change)... We are redefining resilience to mean learning from our shortcomings and preparing the way ahead, way ahead of time," Marcos said, adding that this includes building evacuation centers, early warning systems, and social protection mechanisms.

The CPF will contribute to eight of the World Bank Group's 15 target outcomes, including healthier lives, digital connectivity, learning, climate resilience, and improved private investment.

Marcos thanked the World Bank for nearly 80 years of partnership, citing its financial and technical assistance in

## DBM SEEKS PUBLIC PARTICIPATION IN 2026 BUDGET DELIBERATIONS

**MANILA** — The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) on Tuesday urged the public to take some time to monitor the budget deliberations.

This, as DBM Secretary Amenah Pangandaman backed calls to make the bicameral budget deliberations open to the public to ensure transparency.

"Ang gusto po sana natin ay makibahagi ang ating mga kababayan lalo na po ang ating mga kabataan para malaman po nila kung paano ang mag-gawa ng budget at kung paano ito matatapos (What we would like is for our countrymen, especially our youth, to participate so that they know how to make a budget and how it will be completed)," Pangandaman said during the post-State of the Nation Address conference in San Juan City.

## LTO WAIVES PENALTIES FOR LATE REGISTRATION, FINES IN CALAMITY AREAS

**MANILA** — The Land Transportation Office (LTO) has waived the fines for the late registration of vehicles and renewal of driver's license, and extended the settlement of traffic apprehensions in calamity-stricken areas.

In a statement on Tuesday, LTO acting Assistant Secretary Greg Pua Jr. said the move aligns with President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s order to maximize assistance to Filipinos affected by the successive storms and enhanced southwest monsoon or "habagat" that brought heavy rains and floods last week.

In a memorandum signed by Pua, the waiving of fines covers late motor vehicle registration and driver's license renewal from July 21 to 25.

"Validity of the vehicle registration and driver's license within that period is likewise extended to Aug.

## PBBM OMISSION OF ONLINE GAMBLING IN SONA NOT MISSED OPPORTUNITY: CHIZ

**MANILA** — Senate President Francis Escudero on Tuesday said President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.'s decision to exclude online gambling and other controversial topics from his fourth State of the Nation Address (SONA) should not be seen as a missed opportunity.

"Minabuti ng Pangulo na tutukan lamang 'yung social services. 'Yun ang tila tema ng kanyang talumpati (The President chose to focus solely on social services. That seemed to be the theme of his speech)," Escudero said during a press briefing.

He explained that with so many legislators pushing different advocacies, it would be unrealistic to expect the President to address all of them in one sitting.

"Gusto ba natin tatlong

oras 'yung SONA ng Presidente? Siguro may ibang pagkakataon na pwedeng matalakay pa ng Pangulo 'yan pero hindi siya missed opportunity (Do we want a three-hour SONA? There will be other chances for the President to talk about those issues—it's not a missed opportunity)," he said.

Escudero said issues like online gambling could still be tackled through other platforms, such as interviews or press briefings, and stressed that the President's choice to focus the SONA prevents it from becoming a "chopsuey" of unrelated topics.

On the legislative side, Escudero clarified he is not among the authors of any bills seeking to ban online gambling, but said the matter is expected to be discussed in their

upcoming caucus.

"Hindi ako isa sa mga author nun, so dapat 'yung mga author ang magpanukala nun (I'm not one of the authors, so it's up to them to push the proposal)," he said.

He added that any move to include the proposed ban among priority measures would need consensus from the Legislative-Executive Development Advisory Council (LEDAC), which includes representatives from the Senate, House of Representatives, and the Executive branch.

"If that is the decision of the Senate, 'yun ang isusulong ko naming mga miyembro ng LEDAC (If that's the Senate's position, we in LEDAC will push for it as a priority measure)," Escudero said. (PNA) **BY WILNARD BACELONIA**

## NEARLY 500 SENIOR CITIZENS IN ABRA RECEIVE CASH GIFTS

**BAGUIO CITY** – A total of 468 senior citizens from Abra province have received cash gifts under Republic Act (RA) 11982 or the Expanded Centenarian Act of 2024, the National Commission on Senior Citizens (NCSC) announced Thursday.

The distribution, conducted in partnership with the Provincial Social Welfare and Development Office (PSWDO), covered senior citizens from 25 municipalities who reached the ages of 80, 90, or 100 between March 2024 and June 2025.

## LEYTE LOW-INCOME EARNERS AVAIL OF P20/KG. RICE

**TACLOBAN CITY** – About 3,500 minimum wage earners in Leyte province have already availed of the PHP20 per kg. rice under the "Benteng Bigas Meron (BBM) Na" program as part of the nationwide rollout to make the staple food more accessible to low-income workers.

National Food Authority (NFA) 8 (Eastern Visayas) manager May Ann Sabarre said on Thursday that the initiative has already benefited minimum wage earners of the Philippine Associated Smelting and Refinery (PASAR) Corp. in Isabel, Leyte and the Energy Development Corp. (EDC) in Kananga, Leyte.

"In partnership with the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE), we are ensuring that our minimum wage earners have access to quality and affordable rice," Sabarre told the Philippine News Agency.

"With sufficient stocks in our warehouses, we are ready to provide the requirement of DOLE for

our low-income workers."

About 2,000 minimum wage earners of the EDC have benefited from the rice-selling activity of the regional labor office under the BBM Na program at the Keitech Educational Foundation in Kananga, Leyte on July 21.

The labor department launched the program in Isabel, Leyte on June 13, where 1,500 minimum wage earners of PASAR bought 15,000 kg. of rice.

DOLE-8 head Dax Villaruel said each worker was able to purchase 10 kg. of rice during the one-day selling activity held in their workplaces.

"The DOLE is committed to helping the Filipinos cope with rising prices of goods, particularly rice," Villaruel said in a statement.

The NFA in the region has 275,064 bags of rice stored in 19 warehouses.

**BAGUIO CITY** – The City Disaster Risk Reduction and Management Office (CDRRMO) has renewed its call for barangay councils to identify and secure lots that can be developed into evacuation centers as part of Baguio's drive for disaster resilience.

"Our office and even the mayor are continuing to encourage our barangays to look for lots for their multipurpose hall, which will double as an evacuation center," Charles Carama, chief of the CDRRMO, said in an interview on Thursday.

He said that part of the resiliency effort of the city is to ensure the existence of model evacuation centers where people can be safe and comfortable if they need to evacuate.

He cited Outlook Drive barangay as an example, where local officials identified a lot to build a multipurpose hall despite having a small barangay hall.

Carama also mentioned Bakakeng Central and Irian as model barangays with functioning evacuation facilities.

However, he admitted that Baguio's limited land area poses a significant challenge in achieving the goal of having more evacuation centers.

"We definitely discourage the use of schools as evacuation sites. The barangays are listening, and many are already avoiding using schools for this purpose," he said.

In recent years, barangay halls have served as the primary shelter for families affected by calamities.

According to Carama, many barangays are now renovating their halls to include multipurpose spaces that double as evacuation centers.

## FUEL PRICES FORECAST TO JUMP ANEW NEXT WEEK

**MANILA** — Oil prices will likely increase again next week on global market developments, such as the US-EU trade deal, which reduced the tariff of European exports to the United States to 15 percent, and supply-related factors.

Citing the benchmark for refined petroleum products, the Mean of Platts Singapore (MOPS), and the foreign exchange average as of Thursday, Jetti Petroleum, Inc. president Leo Bellas said diesel prices could increase by PHP0.80 to PHP1 per liter and gasoline prices by PHP1.50 to PHP1.70 per liter.

"The oil markets responded positively

following the trade deal between the US and European Union, while the threat of US sanctions on Russia and buyers of Russian oil has also helped support oil prices this week," Bellas told journalists Friday.

He explained that the price of diesel sustained its rise "as supply tightens while the bigger-than-expected decline in US gasoline stocks supported the view of a strong driving season and as peak summer demand surges."

Another contributor is the weakness of the local currency, he said, with the peso depreciating to the 58-level on Thursday, a day before the implementation of the 19 percent reciprocal

## PSEI, PHP SUSTAIN SLIDE ON EVE OF NEW US TARIFF RATES

**MANILA** — The wait-and-see stance vis-à-vis the implementation of the 19 percent tariff on Philippine exports to the US starting Friday resulted in a further drop in the Philippine Stock Exchange index (PSEi) and the peso Thursday. The main equities index shed 1.04 percent to 6,252.73 points, and the broader All Shares by 1.05 percent to 3,736.91 points. All the sectoral indices also ended in the red, led by the Mining and Oil after it fell 3.01 percent.

Trailing behind were Holding Firms, down by 1.61 percent; Financials, 1.49 percent; Industrial, 1.32 percent; Services, 1.23 percent; and Property, 0.94 percent.

Volume reached 902.65 million, amounting to PHP7.85 billion.

Decliners again surpassed advancers at 134 to 61 while 56 shares were unchanged.

Luis Limlingan, Regina Capital Development Corp. head of sales, said, "Investors are already cautious in their positions about the potential impact and how it might affect

stock market movements ahead of tomorrow's tariff deadline."

"Moreover, days of continuous depreciation of PHP (Philippine peso) against USD (US dollar) take a toll on the overall market sentiment," he said, citing also the mixed results on Wall Street on Wednesday.

The local currency also ended the day at its almost six-month low of 58.32, or since Feb. 4, which Rizal Commercial Banking Corp. (RCBC) chief economist Michael Ricafort traced to tariff issues, the decline of the PSEi, a more cautious stance by the Federal Reserve as it kept anew its key rates after a two-day meeting ending July 30, and the improvement in exports.

The local currency opened the day weaker at 57.86 from its 57.2 start in the previous session. It traded between 57.85 and 58.4, resulting in an average of 58.18.

Volume surged to USD2.6 billion from the previous day's USD1.86 billion. Ricafort forecast the currency to trade between 58.20 and 58.45 on Friday. (PNA) **BY JOANN VILLANUEVA**

## GOV'T COMMITS TO SUSTAIN INCLUSIVE GROWTH — BALISACAN

**MANILA** — The Marcos administration made progress in strengthening the country's macroeconomic fundamentals but the government remains committed to sustaining economic growth, Department of Economy, Planning, and Development (DEPDev) Secretary Arsenio Balisacan said.

In a briefing in Mandaluyong City on Thursday, Balisacan said that from 2023 to the first quarter of 2025, the Philippines remained among Asia's fastest-growing economies.

Balisacan said unemployment also fell below pre-pandemic levels, while underemployment declined in 2023 and 2024. Poverty incidence went down to 15.5 percent in 2023, lifting an estimated 2.4 million Filipinos above the poverty line.

Balisacan said inflation likewise significantly eased from a high of 8.7 percent in January 2023 to just 1.4 percent in June

2025.

According to Balisacan, the Philippines is also poised to achieve upper-middle income status in the near term.

"In the World Bank's estimates of GNI (gross national income) per capita for 2024, we were short of just 26 dollars to become an upper middle-income country," he said.

Despite these gains, Balisacan noted that not all development objectives have been met yet.

"As the President (Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr.) rightly pointed out, improvements in our economic indicators mean little if they do not translate into better lives for the ordinary Filipino. While we have made meaningful progress, the second half of the administration will be crucial in addressing persistent challenges and accelerating service delivery, especially in areas that matter most to our people," he said.

Balisacan said that from 2025 to 2028, the Marcos administration is committed to sustaining rapid and inclusive economic growth.

"We do this by promoting economic diversification, maintaining sound macroeconomic fundamentals, strengthening competitiveness and innovation, and reducing poverty to single-digit levels by the end of the term," he said.

"Transformation for all requires transformation by all. Better coordination and partnerships between the national and local governments, between the executive and legislative branches, and among the public and private sectors and our development partners will be crucial," he added. (PNA) **BY ANNA LEAH GONZALES**

## BSP PROJECTS JULY INFLATION TO SETTLE WITHIN 0.5 TO 1.3%

**MANILA** — The Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) said inflation likely fell to as low as less than 1 percent in July.

In a statement Thursday, the BSP said inflation is projected to settle within the range of 0.5 percent to 1.3 percent during the month.

"Upward price pressures for the month are likely to be driven by higher meat and vegetable prices partly due to unfavorable weather conditions, increased electricity rates, elevated domestic fuel costs, and the depreciation of the peso," the BSP said.

The BSP, however, said that these price pressures could be partially offset by the continued decline in rice prices.

"Going forward, the BSP will continue to monitor developments affecting the outlook for inflation and growth in line with its data-dependent approach to monetary policy decision-making," it said.

Headline inflation settled at 1.4 percent in June.

The Philippine Statistics Authority is scheduled to release the July inflation data on Aug. 5. (PNA)

"I can say that we have a stronger team this year," head coach Ambrocio Gontinas Jr. said in an interview Thursday.

"A Malaysian coach is helping our team prepare for the SEA Games. I am optimistic that we can win more medals."

Zani Lisa Mohamed, who served as head coach

of the Malaysian team, has been supervising the training of the Filipinos at the Lawn Bowls and Petanque National Training Center in Clark, Pampanga since July 1.

"Our athletes are determined to win, so they are working really hard to improve. Techniques must be polished," said the 44-year-old Gontinas, who competed in the 2005 Manila SEA Games.

Gontinas was also a member of the national dragon boat team from 2006 to 2013.

A total of 11 gold medals are at stake in petanque in the 2025 SEA Games, coming from the men's and women's singles; men's,

women's, and mixed doubles; men's, women's, and mixed (2 men+1 woman and 2 women+1 man) triples; and men's and women's shooting.

"There are 22 athletes (12 men and 10 women) going to the SEA Games. All are fighters. They will be ready for the tough challenge ahead," Gontinas said.

The Philippine team is also scheduled to leave for Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia in September for two invitational tournaments and a training camp.
