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NO FILIPINO IN US DEPORTED TO ESWATINI – EMBASSY

MANILA – No Filipino national was among the 10 deported by the United States to the southern African state of Eswatini, the Philippine Embassy in Washington, D.C. said Saturday.

“After verification with the US Immigration and Customs Enforcement, the Embassy was able to confirm that no Filipino citizen has been involved in any third-country deportation from the United States,” it said in a statement.

The embassy said one individual was unable to establish Philippine citizenship and could not be deported to the Philippines.

A US lawyer for two Vietnamese nationals was earlier quoted as saying by reports that the group included “three

Vietnamese, one Filipino, one Cambodian and four [to] six others.”

“The Embassy continues to engage with relevant US authorities to ensure the well-being of its citizens in the United States and maintains its readiness to receive all Filipino citizens under final order of removal,” it said.

The Eswatini government earlier confirmed that 10 foreign nationals arrived in the African Kingdom on Monday, saying they would be kept “in a secured area separate from the public, while arrangements are made for their return to their countries of origin.”

AMLC SECURES 6TH FREEZE ORDER VS. FLOOD CONTROL PROJECT-RELATED ASSETS

MANILA – Thirty-nine bank accounts are included in the sixth freeze order secured by the Anti-Money Laundering Council (AMLC) from the Court of Appeals (CA) Friday, in line with the investigation on irregularities in government flood control projects.

In a statement, AMLC said the other assets in the latest freeze order are four insurance policies, and 59 real estate properties such as residential, commercial and agricultural.

“Several of these properties are linked to a former high-ranking government official suspected of playing a central role in the procurement process of the questioned flood control project contracts,” it said.

A total of 1,671 bank

accounts, 58 insurance policies, 163 motor vehicles, 99 real properties, and 12 e-wallet accounts have been ordered frozen since the first freeze order was issued by the CA last Sept. 16.

“The total estimated value of frozen assets has reached PHP4.67 billion, with the figure expected to rise as additional orders are secured and new leads are uncovered,” AMLC said in the statement.

“We are taking deliberate actions to preserve assets potentially linked to unlawful activity,” AMLC Executive Director Atty. Matthew M. David said. “Our focus remains on ensuring that public funds are protected and that those involved are held accountable through

MANILA – Executive Secretary Lucas Bersamin has recognized the role of the United Nations (UN) and the United Kingdom (UK) in helping advance the country’s human rights roadmap, a Malacañang statement said Friday.

Bersamin made the acknowledgment after the UN and UK formally presented to the Philippine government PHP2.3 million worth of promotional materials for the 4th Philippine Human Rights Plan (PHRP4).

UK Embassy Political Counsellor Andrew Bowes and Signe Poulsen, senior human rights adviser to the UN in the Philippines, turned over to Bersamin the materials in a ceremony at the Presidential Guest House on Oct. 6.

“The PHRP4 is not

merely aspirational, it lays out concrete programs, measurable targets, and timelines, even as it provides for mechanisms of monitoring and accountability, ensuring that human rights commitments are implemented and sustained at all levels,” Bersamin said.

The PHRP4 serves as the Marcos administration’s human rights roadmap that focuses on championing the rights of the vulnerable and marginalized groups, including women, children, persons with disabilities, Indigenous Peoples, migrant workers, and persons deprived of liberty. It was developed through extensive consultations with nearly 500 organizations from civil society, the private sector, academe, media, and grassroots communities nationwide.

Bersamin said this process ensures that the plan is owned by the people and responsive to their lived realities. Meanwhile, he reaffirmed the government’s commitment to the principles enshrined in the Universal Declaration of Human Rights (UDHR), noting that the administration has already delivered on three key pledges made during its 75th anniversary in December 2023 — developing a new national human rights plan, creating a special body for inter-agency coordination on human rights, and establishing a national forensics institute.

“We committed, and we delivered,” Bersamin said. “The PHRP4 reflects our resolve to translate human rights into concrete action that improves people’s lives.” (PNA) **BY JOYCE ANN L. ROCAMORA**

DBM COORDINATING WITH AGENCIES FOR DAVAO QUAKE ASSISTANCE

MANILA – The Department of Budget and Management (DBM) is coordinating with other national government agencies to facilitate necessary emergency assistance to individuals affected by the magnitude 7.4 offshore earthquake in Davao Oriental on Friday. Secretary Amenah Pangandaman said the DBM will continue to monitor the situation and respond accordingly.

The tremor hit Manay town at 9:43 a.m. A tsunami threat was issued but lifted at 1:43 p.m.

“Kami naman po sa DBM, sa utos po ni Pangulong Bongbong Marcos, we will make sure na sa oras ng emergencies o kalamidad, maglalabas po ang pamahalaan ng sapat at kinakailangang tulong para walang patid po ang serbisyo ng frontline agencies na nagpapatupad ng relief and recovery efforts (We at the DBM, on orders of President Bongbong Marcos, will make sure that in times of emergencies or calamities, the government will release sufficient and

necessary assistance so that the services of frontline agencies implementing relief and recovery efforts remain uninterrupted),” she said in a news release.

She instructed all DBM offices to get in touch with the Department of Health, Department of Social Welfare and Development, and Office of Civil Defense to identify how to extend support to the response efforts.

The Philippine Institute of Volcanology and Seismology raised another tsunami alert at 7:12 p.m. following a magnitude 6.8 aftershock.

Residents in the coastal areas of Surigao del Sur, Davao Oriental and Surigao del Norte were ordered to evacuate to higher grounds.

Reports citing Davao Oriental Governor Nelson Dayanghirang said at least three were confirmed dead in Mati City.

NBI NABS DAVAO CITY WOMAN FOR TRAFFICKING OF MINORS

MANILA – The National Bureau of Investigation (NBI) Southern Mindanao office has arrested a woman who operated a spa that exploited minors in Davao City.

In a news release on Friday, the NBI-Southern Mindanao Regional Office said alias “Madam Ram” was arrested at the Heaven Personal Massage Spa on Oct. 7.

The mother and grandmother of a 15-year-old sought help from the NBI after discovering that the massage parlor used sex workers of minor age for PHP3,500 per illicit service.

An operation was conducted, resulting in the arrest of the suspect and the rescue of the victim.

The suspect was charged for violation of Republic Act (RA) No. 10364, otherwise known as the Expanded Anti-Trafficking in Persons Act in relation to RA 7610 or the Special Protection of Children Against Abuse, Exploitation, and Discrimination Act.

The rescued minor was turned over to the Department of Social Welfare and Development for debriefing and medical examination. (BENJAMIN PULTA/PNA)

2026 BUDGET CRAFTED WITH FULL TRANSPARENCY, ACCOUNTABILITY – DY

MANILA – Speaker Faustino Dy III on Friday assured the public that the 2026 national budget is being crafted with full transparency and accountability, as the House of Representatives has put in place new systems to open the budget process to public scrutiny and strengthen oversight during implementation.

In a radio interview, Dy said one of his first reforms he instituted as Speaker of the 20th Congress was the creation of the Budget Amendments and Revisions Sub-Committee (BARSc) -- the body tasked to review and realign appropriations -- and the decision to livestream all its proceedings so that every Filipino can see how lawmakers deliberate and realign funds.

"Isa na po rito ang ginagawa po natin, meron po tayong livestream habang ginagawa po itong BARSc... at doon ho makikita at maririnig ng ating mga kababayan kung papaano isinasayos ang budget (One of these is already being implemented, we livestream the deliberations of the BARSc... and our countrymen could see and hear how the budgets is being crafted," Dy said.

He said this ensures that adjustments in the national budget are aligned with the Marcos administration's priority programs, including the reallocation of recovered funds from flood-control projects to initiatives that directly benefit communities. The Speaker added that the 2026 General Appropriations Bill (GAB) is also being deliberated in open, livestreamed plenary sessions, allowing citizens and civil society organizations to follow the process.

Beyond transparency during deliberations, Dy said the House is working with the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT) to develop a system for monitoring how agencies implement the budget once enacted.

"Nakikipag-ugnayan tayo sa DICT na kung saan baka merong mga sistema

na namo-monitor. Kasi po iba rin po 'yung naipasa nga natin 'yung budget, papaano naman po 'yung implementation (We are coordinating with the DICT for a monitoring system. We may have passed the budget, but how about the implementation)," he said, underscoring the need to monitor how programs are implemented on the ground.

He said the system will help prevent substandard projects and ghost spending by allowing real-time tracking of projects nationwide.

He also cited the importance of cooperation of all citizens and civil societies in safeguarding and monitoring government projects.

The House will take up the 2026 national budget on second reading Friday afternoon in a session to be livestreamed for the public.

The livestreamed deliberations, Dy said, are intended to allow citizens and civil society groups to observe how lawmakers scrutinize and refine the government's spending plan. (PNA) **BY ZALDY DE LAYOLA**

PCW CALLS FOR FAIR PROBE OF MANILA COUNCILOR'S ALLEGED HARASSMENT

MANILA – The Philippine Commission on Women (PCW) on Friday reiterated zero tolerance for sexual harassment following reports that a member of the Manila City Council allegedly harassed a fellow councilor during a regular session of the Sangguniang Panlungsod. In a statement, the PCW expressed deep concern over the incident and reminded all public officials that sexual harassment and other gender-based offenses have no place in government institutions. "Such acts become even more reprehensible when committed by public officials, as they violate not only the rights of women but also the ethical standards that all public servants are sworn to uphold," the PCW said.

Councilor Eunice Castro alleged that Councilor Ryan Ponce committed multiple acts of harassment, including lewd comments about her clothing and unsolicited text messages with sexual undertones. Ponce apologized and said that he did not intend to offend.

Manila Vice Mayor Chi Atienza said the issue has been referred to the City Council's Committee on Ethics for investigation and

pledged support for Castro. The PCW said proven cases of sexual harassment involving public officials may be treated as grave administrative offenses, punishable by suspension, dismissal, or other sanctions, aside from criminal penalties under existing laws.

Under Republic Act (RA) 11313 or the Safe Spaces Act, all forms of gender-based sexual harassment in workplaces, educational settings and government offices -- including unwelcome remarks, gestures or advances that demean, intimidate or objectify women -- are punishable.

Such conducts also violate RA 6713 or the Code of Conduct and Ethical Standards for Public Officials and Employees, which mandates officials to uphold professionalism, respect and integrity.

The Civil Service Commission said any form of harassment is a grave administrative offense, whether between colleagues or subordinates. The PCW urged the local government Manila to ensure that the allegations are investigated promptly and fairly. (PNA) **BY MA. TERESA MONTEMAYOR**

KEY POLICIES ADOPTED AT LOSS AND DAMAGE FUND MANILA MEET

MANILA – The seventh board meeting of the Fund for Responding to Loss and Damage (FRLD) concluded on Thursday, with stakeholders reaching a milestone and marking a decisive step toward making the Fund fully operational and ready to deliver aid to climate change-vulnerable nations. In a press briefing on Friday, FRLD executive director Ibrahim Cheikh Diong described the meeting as "a turning point" in the global effort to assist countries suffering the most from climate-induced disasters.

Diong said pledges to the Fund are now at USD788 million, of which about USD400 million has been released or converted to cash.

He said the meetings held Oct. 7 to 9 in Pasay City resulted in the adoption by the board of critical policies as the Fund moves forward.

"Our board realized that out of the money that has already been pledged and converted into money, into cash flow rate, they wanted to basically set up what they call a standard phase of two years for a USD250 million grant only, USD5 to USD20 million per initiative, and focusing on extreme weather conditions," he said.

Other key milestones Diong cited other significant outcomes of the Manila meeting, including the finalization of the eligibility, accreditation and access modalities, ensuring that developing countries can directly apply for grants without the need for lengthy or complex procedures, which has been the biggest challenge in climate finance.

He said the targeted allocation of the USD250 million start-up phase will prioritize the most exposed countries.

The board also approved the project cycle and funding criteria, which establish a clear and transparent route for countries to apply for grants.

Diong said the grants are intended to cover both extreme weather

conditions, such as severe floods and other extreme weather events, as well as slow-onset impacts.

"Now, the keyword here for us is rapid response. In other words, it's not about just supporting those two areas. When and how the response comes to the country is as important as it is," he said.

"If we come too late, it's not important that we support the country and that's why we are diligently doing our processes so we can be actually efficient, less bureaucratic, accessible, so the money can get back to where it's needed, and that's where we're working," Diong said. In his message to the board read by Department of Environment and Natural Resources Secretary Raphael Lotilla, President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. urged that the Fund's operations remain "swift, accessible, and human-centered."

Lotilla explained that the President's call reflects the dual nature of the climate challenge, that is, preparing for the future while repairing the past.

"Both are necessary because it recognizes that while there is a need to continuously adapt to the adverse impact of climate change, we also need to be able to address the damage that has already been caused. So these two are complementary and that's why the President's call that it should be accessible, those that are in the least position to be able to raise the funds, to address the damage that has been caused, must have access to the funds," he said.

COP30

With the policy frameworks in place, Diong said the FRLD Secretariat will finalize operational templates and launch its first call for funding proposals during the 30th Conference of the Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change or COP30 in Brazil in November.

The COP30 is the world's most important annual climate summit, where governments negotiate actions to address climate change.

"COP30 will be the COP of implementation. After years of negotiations, we are now ready to deliver," Diong said. (PNA) **BY MARITA MOAJE**

OVER 5K FAMILIES GET HOUSING COES UNDER 4 PROCLAMATIONS

MANILA – More than 5,000 families long waiting for land tenure security are set to receive Certificates of Entitlement (COEs) under four presidential proclamations, the Department of Human Settlements and Urban Development (DHSUD) said on Friday.

DHSUD Secretary Jose Ramon Aliling said a total of 5,700 families are expected to benefit from the distribution of COEs covering Presidential Proclamations (PP) 550, s.2004 (Los Baños, Laguna); 463, s.2003 (Lucena City, Quezon); 1538, s.2008 (Iloilo City); and 397, s.2003 (Caloocan City).

"Ang utos ng Pangulong Marcos Jr. ay bigyan ng kapanatagan at mas may dignidad na pamumuhay ang ating mga kababayan (President Marcos Jr.'s directive is to provide our

fellow Filipinos with a more secure and dignified way of life)," he said.

"Yan ang hangad natin sa pagbibigay ng mga COEs sa mga pamilyang matagal nang naninirahan sa mga lupang hindi titulado sa kanila (That is what we aim for through the distribution of COEs to families who have long been living on land that is not titled in their name)," he added.

After decades of uncertainty, these families will finally gain formal recognition of their right to occupy and eventually own the land they have lived on for generations.

The DHSUD targets the distribution of COEs for Iloilo City, Lucena City, and Los Baños as part of the National Shelter Month 2025 celebration, themed "Build Homes, Build Happiness." Beneficiaries under PP397 in Caloocan City are slated

to receive their certificates within the year.

Initially, 840 family-beneficiaries are scheduled to receive their COEs before year-end. Aliling emphasized that the move is a "big step" toward the dreamland title of many Filipinos.

The distribution of COEs is among the new modalities under the Expanded Pambansang Pabahay Para sa Pilipino or 4PH Program, which seeks to provide security of tenure for families occupying untitled or government-proclaimed lots.

Other modalities include rental and incremental housing, vertical (condominium-type) and horizontal (subdivision-type) developments, and an enhanced community mortgage program.

The initiative underscores the Marcos administration's commitment to inclusive

PNP-HPG STRENGTHENS ROAD SAFETY DRIVE ACROSS NEGROS ISLAND

DUMAGUETE CITY, Negros Oriental (PIA) — The Philippine National Police-Highway Patrol Group (PNP-HPG) in the Negros Island Region (NIR) is set to launch a comprehensive road safety and courtesy campaign to educate motorists, students, and private sector employees on responsible road use and accident prevention.

HPG NIR Officer in Charge (OIC) Police Lt. Col. Ma. Delia Pedrezuela, said the campaign aims to address persistent road safety issues by focusing on the '3Es' of traffic management — education, enforcement, and engineering.

"We will educate them on the importance of getting a driver's license and reviewing of vehicles, as well as to train them about traffic management and educate them about the 3Es," said Pedrezuela.

She noted that road infrastructure plays a major role in ensuring safety, pointing out that congestion and accidents often occur in developing areas with narrow roads and inadequate parking spaces.

"Even though some places are still developing, traffic is still rampant because of the imbalance between the number of vehicles and the width of the roads. There are no parking lots designated in these areas, and that's the reason why engineering is significant," she added.

The Department of Public Works and Highways will also be engaged in the campaign, as the installation and maintenance of road safety signs fall under its mandate.

Pedrezuela said the campaign will extend to remote areas, where many motorists remain unaware of traffic regulations, the importance of licenses, and the need for regular vehicle inspections.

Multi-sector involvement Police Executive Master Sgt. Aurelio Bodo, of

the Regional Highway Patrol Unit Special Operations Team (RHPU SOT) in Negros Oriental, emphasized that effective traffic management requires multi-stakeholder collaboration.

"Recently, we were able to issue 32 Temporary Operator's Permit (TOPs) in one day. Despite all of the operations we've conducted, marami pa rin pong na-iinvolve sa road crash incidents. And we don't deny naman na recurring din yung problema. Gagawa tayo ng holistic approach na yung lahat ng stakeholders will have to do their own part," Bodo said.

[Recently, we issued 32 Temporary Operator's Permits (TOPs) in one day, yet road crashes continue to occur. We need a policy-driven approach where all stakeholders take part in promoting road safety.]

The regional HPG plans to hold a stakeholders' meeting with local government officials, the Negros Oriental Chamber of Commerce and Industry (NOCCI), and the Land Transportation Office (LTO) to strengthen partnerships, roll out education campaigns, and craft measures to prevent road accidents.

Bodo underscored that road courtesy and responsible driving practices should start at home.

"Ang akala po kasi nila 'pag sinabing highway eh yung national roads lang. So even sa barangays sinisimulan namin (ang campaign) kasi coming from their houses, they will first see the barangay (road). Eventually pagdating sa national road 'pag malalaki na yung mga sasakyan, kung hindi sila nasanay na sumunod sa traffic rules sa barangay palang, madadala nila yung nakasanayan nila sa national road," Bodo said.

CAMIGUIN VENDORS GO DIGITAL THROUGH DICT'S DIGIPAY, FREE WI-FI PROGRAM

CAMIGUIN(PIA)—Market vendors and residents in Sagay town are now using digital tools after the Department of Information and Communications Technology (DICT)-Camiguin launched the DigiPay Initiative, and Free Wi-Fi for All program at the Sagay Public Market on Oct. 3.

The program supports micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs), market vendors, and consumers by promoting digital payments and providing internet access in public spaces.

"Kami sa DICT mandato gyud namo nga mapa-fast track ang pag-implement sa digitalization sa mga lugar ug mga munisipyo sa bisan asang lugar diri sa atong region," said DICT Camiguin Provincial Officer Engr. James Kevin Sagocsoc.

(It is our mandate in DICT to fast-track the implementation of digitalization in different areas and municipalities in our region.)

Sagocsoc said the DigiPay Initiative has four main components: connectivity, e-commerce and digital payments, the setting up of an e-kiosk, and a hub for freelancers and researchers.

"Mao na ang purpose gyud sa atong DigiPay initiative, ang atong i-mainstream ang digital payment (That is really the purpose of our DigiPay initiative—to mainstream digital payment)," he said.

He added that all public schools and local government units in the province are expected to be connected to the free Wi-Fi service by the end of the year.

The launch included training sessions on digital literacy, e-commerce, and cyber hygiene. DICT Camiguin worked with the Department of Trade and Industry-Camiguin and the Sagay local government in implementing the program. DA-PRDP, EU CELEBRATE COMPLETION OF AF2-EU SUPPORT PHASE IN MINDANAO

DAVAO CITY — The Department of Agriculture –Philippine Rural Development Project (DA-PRDP) Mindanao Cluster, through its Project Support Office in Davao, recently hosted the culminating event for the Second Additional Financing and European Union Co-Financing Grant (AF2-EU) in Davao City.

This milestone gathering brought together local government units (LGUs), community representatives, and development partners to acknowledge the impact of the AF2-EU grant in remote and conflict-affected areas across Mindanao.

Since its launch, the AF2-EU facility has lowered the financial barrier for marginalized LGUs to implement vital agri-fishery projects. By August 2025, 224,000 smallholder farmers and fishers, nearly half of them women, benefited from infrastructure upgrades and enterprise support. Indigenous communities, including those in the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao (BARMM), figured prominently among the grant's direct beneficiaries.

Economic outcomes have been impressive. Household incomes of AF2-EU participants soared by 65 percent, climbing from an average of ₱113,587 to ₱188,000 annually, while micro-enterprise stakeholders reported a remarkable 128 percent boost in earnings. Farmers and fishers also doubled the value of their marketed products through improved market linkages and value-adding activities like coffee consolidation and coco-coir processing. Physical interventions under the grant included the construction of 98.8 kilometers of farm-to-market roads, nine potable water systems, and 19 additional community facilities. These investments slashed travel time to markets by over

half, cut transportation expenses by a quarter, and virtually eliminated household medical costs tied to waterborne diseases—dramatically enhancing local well-being. In her keynote address, World Bank Co-Task Team Leader Maria Theresa Quiñones lauded the European Union's role in amplifying PRDP's reach.

"We are very happy and thankful that the European Union is one of our key partners in joining us in reaching out to our PRDP beneficiaries. To MinDA, which is always on their toes trying to help in the processing and being our champion and advocate, and to PSO Mindanao and the Regional Project Coordination Offices for rising up to the challenge," Quiñones said.

Meanwhile, Marco Gemmer, Head of Cooperation at the EU Delegation, reaffirmed this commitment: "Our objective has always been to reach the most remote areas in Mindanao — the 5th and 6th class municipalities, BARMM, conflict-affected zones, and areas with Indigenous Peoples."

"In Mindanao, there is a wealth of ideas, local knowledge, and wisdom. What our farmers need is not to be taught how to farm, but how to strengthen the enterprise side," Gemmer added.

DA-PRDP Mindanao Director Macario D. Gonzaga echoed these sentiments, emphasizing the evolution of PRDP from a time-bound initiative into a sustainable platform for climate-smart, market-oriented agri-fishery development.

He noted that cooperatives are now more robust, rural infrastructure has been modernized, and private sector engagement has expanded, laying the foundation for inclusive growth. (PIA/FRG, with reports from DA-PRDP Mindanao) **BY FERLIE GUMBOK**

PH PESO CLOSES WEEK SIDEWAYS VS. US\$; PSEI SLIPS ANEW

MANILA – The Philippine peso ended Friday sideways against the US dollar, but its general weakness affected investors' sentiment and was traced as among the factors for the negative close of the local bourse's main index this week.

The local currency ended the day's trading at 58.24 from its 58.23 close a day ago.

It opened the trade weaker at 58.4 from its 57.87 start. It strengthened to as much as 58.16 but was also pulled to 58.43, bringing the day's average to 58.26. Volume went down to USD1.41 billion from the previous session's USD1.92 billion.

On the other hand, the Philippine Stock Exchange index (PSEi) shed for the second consecutive day, by 0.32 percent to 6,037.79 points, and the All Shares by 0.23 percent to 3,658.44 points.

Most of the sectoral gauges also finished the week in the red, led by Mining and Oil which slipped by 2.92 percent.

Holding Firms followed with a 0.78 percent drop, along with Property, 0.56 percent; Financials, 0.43 percent; and Services, 0.05 percent.

Only the Industrial index gained during the day and rose 0.26 percent. Volume reached 1.51 billion, amounting to PHP6.34 billion.

Decliners led advancers at 97 to 79, while 65 shares were unchanged.

"The PSEi continued its decline today despite the recent rate cut from the BSP (Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas)," Regina Capital Development Corporation head of sales Luis Limlingan said, referring to the 25-basis points reduction in the central bank's key rates on Thursday.

"The depreciation of the peso against the US dollar likely dampened investor sentiment and contributed to the cautious outlook of market participants, leading to subdued trading activity overall." (PNA) **BY JOANN VILLANUEVA**

DTI CHIEF CITES COMPLIANCE OF TAGUIG CITY BIZ ON SRPS

MANILA – Department of Trade and Industry (DTI) Secretary Cristina Roque on Thursday said businesses in Taguig City People's Market are compliant with the government's suggested retail prices (SRPs).

This, after teams from the DTI and the Department of Agriculture (DA) conducted price monitoring activity in the said market during the day to ensure that prices of basic necessities and prime commodities (BNPCs) remain low and affordable.

Among the items checked are canned goods, processed milk, coffee, noodles, and condiments. Items in the wet market were also checked, including two Timbangan

ng Bayan public weighing scales.

Roque, chair of the National Price Coordinating Council (NPCC), said prices of these items in the Taguig City People's Market "were lower by PHP0.05 to PHP10.05 than the suggested retail price."

"Our monitoring is non-negotiable, especially when we see positive outcomes like this. The DTI is closely coordinating with manufacturers to ensure there will be no price increases on BNPCs," she said.

"We are intensifying our price monitoring efforts now to guarantee that affordable goods are accessible to every Filipino household, especially as the holiday season is

BSP DELIVERS ANOTHER 25 BASIS POINTS RATE CUT

MANILA – The Monetary Board of the Bangko Sentral ng Pilipinas (BSP) further reduced policy rates by another 25 basis points on Thursday, noting that inflation will remain within target range while growth outlook weakened.

The BSP has so far reduced policy rates by a total of 175 basis points since last year.

The latest cut brings the BSP's Target Reverse Repurchase (RRP) to 4.75 percent and the interest rates on the overnight deposit and lending facilities to 4.25 percent and 5.25 percent, respectively.

In a briefing, BSP Governor Eli Remolona Jr. noted that the outlook for inflation is benign and well within the target range but the outlook for economic growth weakened.

Remolona said the decision reflects the BSP's latest reading of economic conditions as well as adjustments to its model which now reflect the new importance of business sentiment in light of the issues related to government infrastructure spending.

"We now find the inflation outlook to be quite benign. Inflation expectations remain well-anchored but adjustments to electricity rates and possible increases in tariffs on rice imports pose some risks, but these risks look limited," he said.

The BSP projects inflation to settle at 1.7 percent this year.

The forecast stands at 3.1 percent for 2026, down from the earlier 3.3 percent while the projection for 2027 was also revised downward to 2.8 percent from 3.4 percent. Remolona, however, said that the outlook for growth has softened in the near term.

"Governance concerns on public infrastructure spending have weighed on business sentiment. The stock market has declined and there are now fewer companies with expansion plans. Weaker growth means lower demand and lower inflation," Remolona said.

"As the extent of the issues related to infrastructure spending became clear, our estimates of the output gap needed to be calibrated. We now think the gap is wider than we thought," he added.

BSP Deputy Governor Zeno Abenoja said that during the previous assessment, the BSP is looking at growth rates close to the low end of the government's target.

The previous growth projection was at least 5.5 percent for 2025 and at least 6 percent for 2026.

"Right now, we're looking at the near term outlook to be lower than we initially anticipated. There's greater probability that we will be slightly below those targets set by the government. Of course, a lot of this depends on what the governor has mentioned, the infrastructure spending. How will it evolve in the end of the year and into next year," Abenoja said.

"So we're looking at this very closely. There could be some adjustments later on. But we want to better understand the response of the national government and also the business sentiment, how it evolves during this process," he added.

The Monetary Board sees scope for a more accommodative monetary policy stance.

"All in all we see more scope for a more accommodative monetary policy. The favorable inflation outlook and moderating domestic demand provide room for monetary policy to further support economic growth and employment," Remolona said. (PNA) **BY ANNA LEAH GONZALES**

LANDBANK ROLLS OUT NEW LENDING PROGRAM TO EMPOWER MSMES

MANILA – State-run Land Bank of the Philippines (LandBank) rolled out a new lending program to empower micro, small, and medium enterprises (MSMEs) and their partner financial institutions with accessible financing and capacity-building support.

In a statement on Thursday, the bank said LandBank's Innovative Financing Thrust Towards Inclusive National Growth thru Micro, Small, and Medium Enterprises, or the LIFTING MSMEs Lending Program, allows eligible borrowers to use loan proceeds for working capital, business expansion, equipment purchase or upgrade, renovation, digitalization, franchising, export and trade finance, and green or sustainable projects.

The program offers three loan packages.

The start-up loan, ranging from PHP100,000 to PHP500,000, is designed for start-ups and microenterprises with less than one year of operation. It comes with free financial literacy training, minimal collateral requirements, and low welcome interest rates.

For micro and small enterprises with at least one year in operation, LandBank said the step-up loan provides between PHP500,000 and PHP5 million in financing, with added benefits such as free training, interest rate reductions, provision of Point-of-Sale (POS) terminal, and eligibility to transition to higher financing.

The level-up loan, meanwhile, which is available to small and medium enterprises with more than three years of operations, offers up to

PHP500 million.

It provides strategic funding to scale businesses further, coupled with lower interest rates and access to a LandBank corporate credit card.

Under the program, LandBank also extends a rediscounting line to credit cooperatives, rural banks, and microfinance institutions (MFIs) that provide loan services to MSMEs to boost their lending capacity, covering up to 85 percent of outstanding receivables.

"MSMEs are the backbone of the Philippine economy, making up 99.6 percent of total business establishments and employing 65% of the total workforce. Every loan extended to an MSME creates a ripple effect — sustaining jobs, uplifting families, and strengthening communities. Through the LIFTING MSMEs Lending Program, LandBank is fueling this multiplier effect to accelerate inclusive and sustainable growth across the nation," said LandBank President and CEO Lynette Ortiz.

Interested borrowers may apply for the LIFTING MSMEs Lending Program through the bank's Business Loan Application portal, an online platform where loan applicants can directly submit their applications without the need for manual intervention.

He posted 17 points, 12 rebounds, 11 assists, three steals and one block as the Bullpups rolled to their fifth straight win.

Khobutin's triple-double performance was the tournament's fourth after UST's Andwele Cabañero delivered 20 points, 15 rebounds and 10 assists in a 105-71 victory over Ateneo de Manila University on Nov. 27, 2024.

"We still need to improve

MANILA – Adamson University clobbered Far Eastern University, 25-19, 25-19, 25-14, in the 2025 Women's V-League Collegiate Challenge finals at the Filoil EcoOil Center on Friday.

The Lady Falcons bounced back from a 13-25, 22-25, 25-15, 23-25 loss in Game 2 on Wednesday to claim their fourth overall crown. Adamson bagged its third V-League title after winning in 2008 and 2010 under coach Dulce Pante with standouts Pau Soriano and Lizlee Gata-Pantone.

The Lady Falcons, bannered by Trisha Genesis, also pocketed the 2019 PVL Collegiate Conference crown with coach Lerma Giron.

The 2023 edition, held in Antalya, Turkey, drew 283 athletes from 64 countries.

"We have had a tremendous response to our hosting of this event and as of now there over 70 countries and close to a thousand athletes who will be competing in this event," said Gymnastics Association of the Philippines president Cynthia Carrion, who also thanked Finnegan for supporting the blue-ribbon event.
