 BE READY TO FACE 'CHALLENGE BUT
 NOBLE PATH OF PUBLIC SERVICE'**

President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. on Tuesday acknowledged the sacrifices of the 206 graduates of the Philippine National Police Academy (PNPA) "Sinaglawin" Class of 2025. "Hindi biro ang inyong pinagdaanan. Hindi rin biro ang inyong tatahakin," the President said.

During the 46th commencement exercises held at the PNPA ground in Camp Castañeda in Silang, Cavite, the President said the graduates who would leave the academy gates as full-fledged police lieutenants, would surely "face a challenging but noble path of public service — one that will test their ideals, principles, and convictions."

"But whenever those days come and doubts creep in, remember who you are and why you chose this path," President Marcos said.

Officials from the Department of the Interior and Local Government (DILG) and the Philippine National Police (PNP) attended the PNPA graduation rites, as well as the graduates' parents and relatives.

Strategies and best practices

Graduates agreed with President Marcos about the sacrifices they endured during their four years in the academy.

They shared their strategies and best practices, which helped them complete the tasks. The second placer, Police Lt. Kristina Aragoncillo Acidre, said, "If you can find balance in academics and tactics, then surely you will be able to survive."

Acidre received the Vice Presidential Kampilan Award and Special Academics Awards for Best in Laws and Jurisprudence and Best in Public Safety Administration.

"It is very difficult—the physical demands. We are already college degree graduates. So, it is very hard to be in that kind of environment. It boils down to managing academics and tactics," Acidre said.

"We also have to be tactically proficient. So, when it comes to academics, it is a matter of studying smart and not studying hard. Hindi pwede igugol mo lahat ng oras mo sa pag-aaral," she said during a press briefing at the PNPA compound before the 46th commencement exercises.

The top graduate is Police Lt. Marc Joseph Lacatan Vitto, from Gloria, Oriental Mindoro. Vitto received the Presidential Kampilan Award and Journalism Kampilan Award under the Institutional Awards and Special Academic Awards for Best in Forensic Science and Best in General Education.

"Guided by our honor code system, we cadets do not lie, cheat, steal, nor tolerate among us those who do," Vitto said. "And those values and principles, we will carry once we step outside the academy's portals and serve as police officers with dignity and integrity."

Police Lt. Jay Cheever Goyha Rocaberte of Dumaguete City, Negros Oriental, is ranked third among the top graduates of the class. Rocaberte received the Secretary of the DILG Kampilan Award.

The top four to 10 graduates are as follows: Police Lieutenants Matilde Macachor Deligero, Christian Martin Dagupan Bumanglag, Chanchai Acoba Nacion, Lyka Pepito Antig, Daniel Abejuela Lisondra, Xien Lei Juan Buyuccan, and Rizel Erika Pudang Taipan. | PND

DLSU, DILG PUSH FOR ACCOUNTABILITY IN BARANGAY LEADERSHIP

DASMARIÑAS CITY, Cavite (PIA) – A professor from the De La Salle University – Dasmariñas (DLSU-D) underscored the importance of upholding ethical and accountable leadership among public officials.

During the launch of the Executive Program on Barangay Leadership: Ethics, Accountability, and Development (B-LEAD) Dr. Rommel Mazo, Director of the School of Governance, Public Service, and Corporate Leadership, reminded elected officials to uphold accountability in public service.

"Public office is a public trust. Our government officials are in their positions because the people trust them. People will trust them if these public officials govern with accountability and integrity," he said

Taking off from the university's Sustainable Barangay Leadership and Governance (BALAG) and the ongoing implementation of the Barangay Peace and Conflict Transformation (B-PACT) Executive Programs, B-LEAD provides barangay and Sangguniang Kabataan

officials the skills and knowledge on the principles of ethical and sustainable governance and their role in upholding ethical and accountable public service.

"[Government] Positions are public property. We run for office because we believe that we can contribute to national and local development. We are there because the people trust us. Remember that running for a position and occupying a position is always for public service, not personal interest."

Thelma Vecina, executive director of the Local Government Academy (LGA), emphasized the shared responsibility of local government units in upholding accountability at the grassroots level.

"Governance should be shared. The barangay captain cannot do it alone, and the Sangguniang Barangay cannot manage the barangay by themselves. They need partners and allies in governance."

RESERVISTS, ROTC CADETS PLAY VITAL ROLE IN NATIONAL SECURITY

CALAMBA CITY, Laguna (PIA) — In an effort to recognize the vital role of soldiers as well as Reserve Officers' Training Corps (ROTC) cadets and veterans, the Second Infantry "Jungle Fighter" Division of the Philippine Army held its first Reservists, ROTC, and Veterans' Day in Camp Capinpin in Tanay, Rizal.

According to Lt. Col. Jeffrex G. Molina, chief of the Division Public Affairs Office (DPAO) of 2ID, the initiative is a meaningful tribute in honoring the contributions of reservists, ROTC cadets, and veterans in safeguarding national defense and readiness in bolstering the Armed Forces of the Philippines (AFP) in times of need.

During the Sulong Calabarzon public affairs program, Molina also stated that the initiative was inspired by the recent Regional Annual Administrative and Tactical Inspection (RAT), which evaluated the operational readiness of various ROTC units.

"This initiative was strongly supported by our Division Commander, Major General Cerilo Balaoro Jr., because he saw the importance of dedicating a day of recognition to our ROTC cadets, reservists, and especially our veterans—to honor their loyalty and dedication as protectors of the nation," Molina explained.

Molina also emphasized that ROTC cadets serve as the primary pool for future reservists, who play a vital role in both national defense and disaster response. Likewise, veterans, from World War II heroes to recently

retired military personnel, continue to be pillars of wisdom and strength in society whose selfless sacrifices have laid the foundation for the country's safety and sovereignty. He added: "Just because their active duty has ended doesn't mean their service is over, they still hold an important place in safeguarding our people and assisting in times of crisis."

In addition, Molina reiterated that reservists make up 80 percent of the military's total force, while regular soldiers comprise 20 percent, combining both will form a formidable and resilient force capable of responding immediately to both natural disasters and security threats.

The 49th founding anniversary celebration of the division was attended by 203 ROTC cadets from various academic institutions, including the Kurios Christian Colleges Foundation, Cavite State University, University of Rizal System-Morong, University of Rizal System-Tanay, Laguna State Polytechnic University, and Southern Luzon State University-Infanta. 271 reservists from 401st, 402nd, 403rd, 404th, and 405th Community Defense Center Ready Reserve Infantry Battalions and 48 veterans from the Eastern Rizal AFP Retirees and Pensioners Association Inc. (ERAFRPAI).

BENEFITS THAT MATTER FOR SOLO PARENTS

This fourth week of April, the nation celebrates Solo Parents Week, casting the spotlight on the unwavering strength and daily sacrifices of Filipino solo parents. Among them is Rose Cortes, a single mother of four, who works as a housekeeper in a condominium in Quezon City, earning minimum wage.

For years, Rose faced the reality of raising her children on her own, budgeting every peso just to put food on the table, pay for school needs, and cover household bills. But things have become a bit lighter, thanks to Republic Act 11861 or the Expanded Solo Parents' Welfare Act. "Mabuti at salamat at may mga ganito pala kaming mga solo parent na makukuha," Rose shared. (It's good and I'm thankful that we solo parents actually have benefits like these that we can receive.)

RA 11861, signed into law in 2022, expands the definition of solo parents and strengthens government support for them. Solo parents are now entitled to a wide array of benefits, including:

- Monthly cash subsidy of ₱1,000 for minimum wage earners with children aged 0-22 (not married and not working).
- 10% discount and VAT exemption on baby's basic necessities such as milk, diapers, and medicines for children aged 0-6.
- Seven-day parental leave, on top of existing leave benefits.
- Priority access to livelihood, scholarship, housing, and employment assistance from government agencies.
- Automatic PhilHealth coverage, if not yet enrolled.
- Flexible work schedule and protection from work discrimination.

To qualify for these benefits, solo parents must present a Solo Parent ID, which can be obtained from the local Social Welfare and Development Office

(SWDO) by submitting the following:

- Barangay certification proving solo parent status.
 - Birth certificates of children.
 - Proof of income.
 - Supporting documents based on status (e.g., death certificate of spouse, court documents for legal separation, etc.).
- Under RA 11861, the definition of a solo parent now includes:
- Women who give birth as a result of rape or other crimes against chastity.
 - Spouses of OFWs away for at least a year.
 - Legal guardians or foster parents solely responsible for a child.
 - Family members or relatives who assume the role of a parent due to abandonment or absence of both parents.
 - Pregnant women without partners.

As of 2025, the Department of Social Welfare and Development (DSWD) has rolled out the Solo Parent Cash Assistance Program, continuing its ₱1,000 monthly subsidy program for qualified solo parents nationwide. The DSWD has also partnered with LGUs to streamline Solo Parent ID applications and conduct barangay-level information drives to ensure that solo parents are aware of their rights and how to access them.

For Rose and many others like her, these changes are more than policy updates — they are lifelines.

"Malaking tulong, lalo na di talaga kasya ang sweldo sa panggastos naming mag-iina."

(It's a big help, especially since my salary really isn't enough to cover our family's expenses.)

This Solo Parents Week, let us honor the resilience of solo parents and amplify awareness of laws designed to support them. Because when we uplift one solo parent, we empower an entire family. **(AVS / PIA-NCR) BY ALICE V. SICAT**

DOTR AWAITS CATHAY PACIFIC EXPLANATION ON RIPPED PASSPORT INCIDENT

MANILA – The Department of Transportation (DOTr), through the Civil Aeronautics Board (CAB), has ordered Cathay Pacific to explain the alleged passport mishandling incident which led to the denial of boarding of a passenger at Mactan-Cebu International Airport last week.

Based on the CAB incident report, the 65-year-old passenger was supposed to board Flight CX948 bound for Dubai, United Arab Emirates on April 24.

However, during the check-in process, the passenger's passport was allegedly torn while being handled by the airline staff, rendering it invalid for boarding.

The passenger complained that the airline staff did not provide any explanation or immediate assistance, and just continued to process other passengers. Cathay Pacific's explanation was due

Thursday.

Transportation Secretary Vince Dizon directed all airlines to ensure that no intentional tampering of passports occurs at airports and reminded personnel to exercise their authority responsibly and respectfully when verifying the validity of travel documents.

On the other hand, the New NAIA Infra Corp. management said passengers at Ninoy Aquino International Airport are no longer required to show their passports at the entrance gates.

All security personnel have been instructed not to touch passports during terminal entry and security verification. A valid identification card or travel document will do, to be held only by the passenger.

Passport inspection will be handled by the airline staff at check-in counters, by immigration officers, and by airline personnel at the boarding gates. **(PR/PNA)**

DEPED BOOSTING INTERVENTION AMID POOR LITERACY REPORT AMONG GRADS

MANILA – The Department of Education (DepEd) assured on Thursday that the government has been intensifying interventions in schools following reports of more than 18 million high school graduates from 2019-2024 considered "functional illiterate".

DepEd Secretary Sonny Angara said instead of memorization, the agency is making efforts to help students become critical thinkers while teaching them 21st-century skills.

"Hindi namin hahayaang may batang nahuhuli sa pagbasa at pag-unawa (We will not let any child fall behind reading and comprehension). The recent FLEMMS results on functional literacy highlight what we have long recognized - literacy must be at the heart of our education reforms," he

said.

The government, he said, is improving the teaching and assessment method as well as the remedial and literacy programs in schools.

Angara said the agency will ensure that every Filipino learner is functionally literate and prepared for the future.

Lawmakers on Wednesday raised alarm over the results of the 2024 Functional Literacy, Education, and Mass Media Survey (FLEMMS), which revealed that over 18 million high school graduates from 2019 to 2024 cannot read and comprehend.

The Philippine Statistics Authority defines a functionally literate person as someone who can read, write, compute, and comprehend. **(PNA) BY JOYCE ANN L. ROCAMORA**

10 CIDG MEMBERS UNDER RESTRICTIVE CUSTODY FOR 'ROBBERY EXTORTION'

MANILA – Ten members of the Criminal Investigation and Detection Group (CIDG) assigned in the Southern Metro Manila District Field Unit were put under restrictive custody and detained at the Philippine Custodial Facility for alleged kidnapping and robbery extortion as ordered by Director Maj. Gen. Nicolas Torre III.

"Last Monday, April 28, upon receipt ng report ng (of the report of) Integrity Monitoring and Enforcement Group (IMEG), immediately, Gen. Torre put under restrictive custody 10 CIDG personnel and ordered them to be detained," PNP spokesperson Brig. Gen. Jean Fajardo told reporters in a press briefing held at Camp Crame on Thursday. Initial investigation revealed that on Feb. 17, 2025, the accused personnel raided a warehouse at First Tondo Complex, Tondo,

Manila and brought their targets to the CIDG office

in Taguig City for alleged violation of the Republic Act 10591, also known as the Comprehensive Firearms and Ammunition Regulation Act.

Afterward, the CIDG operatives allegedly demanded money in exchange for the release of their victims.

The PNP IMEG report showed that on April 21, the filing of administrative cases against the accused cops was recommended "for grave misconduct, conduct unbecoming of a police officer, and neglect of duty."

Torre said the cops' issued firearms and badges were immediately recalled and turned over to the CIDG NCR Logistics Section.

"Hindi ko papayagan at itolerate ang mga ganitong pangyayari sa CIDG (I will not allow and tolerate these kinds of incident in the CIDG)," Torre said. **(PNA) BY CHRISTOPHER LLOYD CALIWAN**

JAPANESE MINESWEEPING UNIT VISITS PH NAVY

MANILA – The commander of the Japan Maritime Self-Defense (JMSDF)'s Minesweeping Division 3 paid a courtesy visit to the Philippine Navy (PN), highlighting the growing military ties between the two countries.

Naval Air Wing Deputy Commander Capt. Emerson David, representing Philippine Fleet chief Rear Adm. Joe Anthony Orbe, welcomed JMSDF Minesweeping Division 3 commander Capt. Amano Shinsuke and his delegation at the Navy headquarters, Naval Station Jose Andrada, Roxas Boulevard, Manila on April 29, the PN said in a news release Thursday. Minesweeping refers to the removal or disarming of explosive naval mines in the water using specialized vessels called minesweepers.

The visit aligns with the

goodwill visit of JMSDF vessels JS Bungo (MST-464) and JS Etajima (MSO-306) to the country.

This naval visit emphasizes the strong defense ties and mutual support between the two navies. During the meeting, both sides discussed ongoing and future collaborations, exchanged insights on operational best practices, and reaffirmed their shared commitment to regional maritime security and stability.

MALACAÑANG DISMISSES SENIOR CITIZENS COMMISSION EXEC

MANILA – Malacañang has ordered the dismissal of National Commission of Senior Citizens (NCSC) Commissioner Reymar Mansilungan for serious dishonesty, grave misconduct and conduct prejudicial to the best interest of the service.

In a decision dated April 23, 2025 made public Friday, the Office of the President said Mansilungan committed serious offenses such as falsifying his academic qualifications, misusing government funds, and disobeying directives.

Executive Secretary Lucas Bersamin signed the ruling following complaints filed by Senior Citizens Partylist Rep. Rodolfo Ordanes and a certain Miguelito Garcia. Garcia and Ordanes accused Mansilungan of misrepresenting his educational background in his application for the position.

Mansilungan claimed to have earned a Bachelor of Arts in Mass Communication (Journalism) from the University of the Philippines (UP), but a certification from UP's Office of the University Registrar stated

that "there is no record of enrollment of Mansilungan in the said institution."

The order also cited alleged misuse of NCSC resources.

Despite having jurisdiction only over North Luzon, Mansilungan allegedly spent time and agency funds conducting activities in South Luzon, Visayas, and Mindanao, which are outside his assigned regions.

Liquidation reports and travel documents supported these claims. He also reportedly awarded midyear bonuses to contract-of-service workers who are not entitled to the incentives.

The Palace found the violations constitute serious dishonesty, gross neglect of duty, grave misconduct, and gross insubordination.

"This Office reiterates that public officials and employees are obliged to remain true to the people at all times," the decision read. "Integrity is the capital of government workforce, hence dishonest acts are much to be condemned." **(PNA) BY FILANE MIKEE CERVANTES**

SENATE INVITES AD FIRM TO PROBE ALLEGED DEAL WITH CHINESE EMBASSY

MANILA – The Senate has invited InfinitUs Marketing Solutions, Inc. to attend a hearing next week on its alleged 2023 deal with the Chinese embassy to run pro-Beijing social media campaigns, Senate Majority Leader Francis Tolentino confirmed Thursday.

Tolentino, who chairs the Senate Special Committee on Maritime and Admiralty Zones, said the firm will be given a chance to air its side.

The inquiry is part of an ongoing probe into

foreign interference and espionage.

"We want to strengthen our democracy. We may not make it bulletproof, but we can make it stronger," Tolentino said in a statement.

The Senator has filed a legislation that seeks stiffer penalties, tighter regulations, and greater public awareness.

He said local troll farms aiding foreign actors could be held liable, with keyboard warriors potentially charged as accessories. **(PNA) BY WILNARD BACELONIA**

MANILA – President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. pledged on Thursday that the government would do its best to protect and promote workers' rights and welfare. This, as he paid tribute to the toil and sacrifices of the Filipino workforce on Labor Day. TOKYO SAYS INVESTMENTS TO CLIMB ONCE PH BECOMES UPPER MIDDLE INCOME

MANILA – The Philippines would receive reduced Japanese official development assistance (ODA) once it reaches an upper-middle-income status, but Tokyo said it can expect higher investments in return. In a media luncheon in Makati City on Wednesday, Japanese Foreign Ministry Press Secretary Toshihiro Kitamura affirmed that

sa lahat (We sincerely affirm that we will not abandon you, but rather will further support you - not just as a duty, but as gratitude and recognition of your true value and sacrifice. A meaningful and peaceful celebration to all)," he said. Japan is eager to support the country reach its goal to graduate into an upper middle income state by 2026.

"Our ODA vary according to the category of the countries, if one country becomes a high-income country, probably we cannot provide the ODA as it were up to now," he said. "But at the same time, ODA is not the only tool to support the economic growth of the country, we also mobilize our private sources— As for the Philippines, there are more than 1,600 Japanese company operating here and we'd like to support further investment of Japanese companies here."

Kitamura said development assistance that creates a conducive environment for investments and businesses in the Philippines could be among the possible ODAs that would stay. Japan's ongoing support for inclusive development in the Bangsamoro region is also highly likely to continue.

"We are not going to stop everything immediately, but we'll try to provide every possible measure which could help the Philippines," the official said.

Department of Economy, Planning, and Development Secretary Arsenio Balisacan earlier said the Philippines is "well-positioned to achieve upper-middle-income status by 2026," barring major external shocks and assuming a favorable global trade environment.

An upper-middle-income economy has a gross national income (GNI) per capita of USD4,256-13,205. In 2023, the Philippines' GNI was at USD4,335 or PHP241,165, according to the Department of Finance. In a summit on Tuesday, Prime Minister Shigeru Ishiba and President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. agreed to strengthen cooperation on agriculture, and information and telecommunication technology areas.

The two leaders also pledged to strengthen public-private partnerships

DND: PROTECTION OF PH TERRITORY VITAL FOR ECONOMIC PROGRESS

MANILA – The Department of National Defense (DND) on Thursday vowed to spare no effort in securing the country and its territories for various development projects of the Marcos administration to bear fruit.

PNP WANTS ANSON QUE'S SON DELISTED AS RESPONDENT IN KIDNAP-SLAY CASE

MANILA – The Philippine National Police (PNP) on Thursday said it will ask for the removal of the name of businessman Anson Que's son from the list of respondents in connection with the kidnap-slay case it recently filed at the Department of Justice (DOJ).

PNP spokesperson Brig. Gen. Jean Fajardo said there are no corroborative pieces of evidence to support the claim of David Tan Liao, a Chinese national, that Que's 42-year-old son Ronxian Gou or Alvin Aue, was involved in the killing of his father.

"Walang direktang ebidensya na maglilink kay Alvin Que dito sa nangyaring panginidnap sa kanyang ama (There is no direct evidence linking Alvin Que to the kidnaping of his father)," Fajardo said in press briefing at Camp

Crame.

"We are considering that but we also have to consider that we have to take the whole statement of Liao not only with regard doon sa sinasabi niya at allegations si Alvin Que yung nag utos siya (to what he says and allegations that Alvin ordered it)."

Liao is one of the key players in the kidnapping and killing of Anson Que. He surrendered after two Filipino suspects were arrested in Palawan.

Alvin Que's legal counsel Kit Belmonte said the PNP explained to him that the inclusion of the name of his client was based on Liao's allegations.

"The PNP communicated to us that, aside from the bare assertion of David Tan Liao, no other evidence can be adduced against Alvin, thus they are submitting a motion to the DOJ to amend the complaint

requesting the removal of Alvin's name from the list of respondents," Belmonte in a statement sent to reporters.

"We thank the Philippine National Police under the leadership of Chief PNP Gen. Rommel Marbil for the swift clarification on the erroneous reports regarding Mr. Alvin Que," he added.

Fajardo said Alvin Que is cooperating with the Anti-Kidnapping Group and has submitted his cell phone to undergo forensic and scientific processing.

Anson Que, a steel magnate, and his driver Armanie Pabillo were last seen in Valenzuela City on March 29 after leaving the former's office in Valenzuela City.

Their bodies were found by a roadside in Rodriguez, Rizal on April 9. (PNA) BY CHRISTOPHER LLOYD CALIWAN

GOV'T CONDONES OVER P15-M DEBTS OF KABANKALAN CITY ARBS

BACOLOD CITY – A total of 111 agrarian reform beneficiaries (ARBs) in Kabankalan City, Negros Occidental, have been relieved of debts amounting to PHP15.378 million under the Republic Act (RA) 11953 or the New Agrarian Emancipation Act. The certificates of condonation with the release of mortgage (CoCRoMs) were distributed to identified farmers under the Department of Agrarian Reform (DAR) Negros Occidental 2 (South) in a ceremony held on Tuesday led by Provincial Agrarian Reform Program Officer II Arnulfo Figueroa, District Manager Elma Popioco, and City Assessor Roldan Dunque.

"We continue to stress the importance of the parcel of land awarded to the beneficiaries and the opportunities it presents," Figueroa said in a statement on Thursday. On behalf of the recipients, ARB Romulo Jimenez

expressed his appreciation to the DAR for the financial relief. The distribution of the CoCRoMs in Kabankalan City came after 25 ARBs in Bago City also received significant financial relief after the government condoned their debts totaling PHP3.48 million. The beneficiaries from Barangay Bacong in Bago City were presented with CoCRoMs on April 15. RA 11953 writes off all outstanding loans, including accrued interests, penalties, and surcharges, incurred by ARBs for lands awarded to them, allowing the farmers to redirect their resources toward enhancing their agricultural productivity. ARMY, REBELS CLASH IN NEGOR AHEAD OF POLLS

DUMAGUETE CITY – Government troops of the 62nd Infantry Battalion of the Philippine Army clashed with suspected members of the New People's Army (NPA) in three separate incidents in Guihulngan City, Negros Oriental on Thursday.

Lt. Col. Evelio Ilanga, commanding officer of the 62IB, told the Philippine News Agency that the initial clash occurred around 6 a.m. in Barangay Humay-humay, where soldiers encountered about nine remnants of the dismantled Central Negros 1 (CN1) guerrilla front.

A brief three-minute firefight ensued before the insurgents retreated. The soldiers recovered one high-powered firearm, some live rounds of ammunition, magazines, and personal belongings that were left behind by the suspected NPA rebels.

Ilanga said that pursuit operations led to two more brief skirmishes with the same group later that day at separate locations. He refused to give further details.

He assured the public that the military is working to prevent any disruption by the NPA during the upcoming elections, particularly in Guihulngan City.

Based on the Commission on Elections' (Comelec) classification of election hotspots, Guihulngan City and La Libertad are currently under the red category—the highest level—due to the presence of armed groups.

Basay has been placed under the orange category, while the remaining 22 towns and cities in Negros Oriental are classified under the yellow category. **(PNA) BY MARY JUDALINE PARTLOW**

P36M IN LIVELIHOOD GRANTS RELEASED TO VULNERABLE WORKERS IN W. VISAYAS

ILOILO CITY – In line with its mission to combat poverty through sustainable livelihood, the Department of Labor and Employment (DOLE) released PHP36.05 million in grants to support 1,422 vulnerable individuals in Western Visayas during the Labor Day celebration on Thursday.

The distribution of funds was highlighted during the event's opening at Robinsons Place Iloilo, where seven livelihood projects from Iloilo and Guimaras received a combined PHP11.3 million. These initiatives, set to benefit 318 recipients, include fish and rice trading, community and sari-sari stores, dishwashing liquid production, and farm machinery services.

Simultaneous grant releases took place across other provinces in the region, further extending support to local communities.

In addition to the livelihood grants, DOLE hosted a job fair featuring 8,337 local job openings and 966 overseas opportunities. DOLE Western Visayas regional director lawyer Sixto Rodriguez urged employers to hire as many applicants and

job seekers and fill in all vacancies needed for their companies.

"This is a way of standing by our moral obligation to provide decent employment to our job seekers," he said in his message.

As of Thursday, only 2,120 job seekers have preregistered, as per DOLE data.

The Labor Day celebration also gathered farmer and fisherfolk exhibitors joining the Kadiwa ng Pangulo. On the same day, DOLE launched the Kadiwa store in partnership with the rank-and-file employees union of Central Philippine University.

"We encourage you to support the products of our local farmers and producers at the Kadiwa and Livelihood Fair that covers affordable and fresh products from 34 government-assisted sellers and six DOLE-assisted livelihood projects," Rodriguez said. Among the exhibitors was Lorie Noblezada, owner of the De Paul Artisanal Manufacturing ("BudBud" Sea Salt) from Miagao, Iloilo.

She said she always finds Kadiwa helpful because it is an opportunity for them to market their products in other places and for buyers to appreciate the significance of a local product.

"We encourage our fisherfolk and farmers to join. Here, we also have learning; we can connect with our fellow farmers and barter our products," she said in an interview.

Noblezada said budbud is a traditional salt-making, once a dying industry but was revived with the help of the government.

Frank Longno, a rice and vegetable farmer from Sta. Barbara has been joining Kadiwa since January. Twice a month, they displayed their products at the provincial capitol.

"We consolidate the products of our fellow farmers in Sta. Barbara, and bring them to the venue so they can also earn," Longno said in a separate interview. **(PNA) BY PERLA LENA**

MANILA – For three consecutive months, fuel companies have implemented rollbacks on liquefied petroleum gas (LPG).

In separate advisories, Petron, Regasco, and Solane slashed LPG prices by PHP1 per kilogram (kg). The rollbacks took effect 12:01 a.m. of May 1. This adjustment would

bring down the cost of a regular 11-kg. household LPG cylinder by PHP11.

According to Petron, the price movement reflects the international contract price of LPG for May.

GOV'T REVENUES, EXPENDITURES SUSTAIN GROWTH IN Q1

MANILA – The national government's revenue collections and expenditures continued to grow in the first quarter of the year, data from the Bureau of the Treasury (BTr) showed.

In its latest cash operations report released on Tuesday, the BTr said revenue collections rose by 6.90 percent to PHP998.2 billion from PHP933.7 billion in the first quarter of 2024.

Of the total, tax collections increased by 13.55 percent to PHP931.5 billion due to the strong performance of the Bureau of Internal Revenue and the Bureau of Customs.

"The revenue agencies' sustained growth for the third consecutive month was driven by their ongoing revenue enhancement measures, particularly the intensified campaign against the use of fake receipts, intensified crackdown on illicit trade, digitalization, and improvements in tax payment facilitation, among other initiatives," the BTr said.

Non-tax revenues, on the other hand, amounted to PHP66.7 billion, lower than last year's PHP113.4 billion.

The BTr said the decline was "largely due to timing as 18 Government-Owned and -Controlled Corporations (GOCCs) remitted PHP28.23 billion in early first quarter dividends in 2024 compared with only three GOCCs with PHP0.027 billion early dividends for the current year."

The BTr, however, expects non-tax revenues to improve in the coming months, with dividends from the GOCCs set to be remitted to the National Treasury starting May.

Expenditures The BTr said government spending was on target at PHP1.5 trillion or 23.89 percent of the full-year expenditure program.

The expenditures in the first quarter of the year was also higher by 22.43 percent than the recorded PHP1.21 trillion in the same period last year.

"The strong spending performance can be attributed to the higher disbursements recorded in the Department of Public Works and Highways for its road infrastructure program and regular operating requirements, and in the Department of Social Welfare and Development for its various protective services programs," the BTr said.

The BTr said significant fiscal transfers to local government units were also made that include their National Tax Allotment shares, the Annual Block Grant to the Bangsamoro Autonomous Region in Muslim Mindanao, as well as Local Government Support Fund releases.

The transfer of PHP32.8 billion to the Coconut Farmers and Industry Trust Fund in accordance with the mandated schedule of capitalization also contributed to the larger spending outturn, the bureau added.

The BTr, meanwhile, said that for the first quarter of

ASIALINK DIVERSIFIES TO REAL ESTATE LENDING

MANILA – Asialink Finance Corporation, known for lending to small and medium enterprises, is diversifying into real estate lending, offering quick processing and low interest rates to individuals and small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

In a statement Thursday, Asialink said it is offering three types of lending under this move namely Sangla Titulo (loan using land title as collateral), take-out of housing units, and acquisition of property. Under Sangla Titulo, a business entity can borrow up to PHP20 million and offer property as collateral. The interest rate is 0.8 percent if up to five years, plus a one-time 5.5 percent as service fee.

For the take-out of housing units, Asialink advances the full payment for the property on behalf of the borrower at an interest rate same with Sanlang Titulo. Asialink said the release

of the funds is faster by a few months than bank processing time.

For acquisition of property, Asialink can lend up to PHP15 million for the purchase of a property, at a rate of 0.9 percent per month for loans with a term of five years and below, and one percent if up to 10 years.

"Our sustained and astronomical growth in the past few years has attracted the flow of foreign funds as well as local financing that now allow us to go into new opportunities such as real estate," Sam Cariño, President and CEO of Asialink Finance Corporation, said.

The company earlier attracted investments from the International Finance Corporation, an arm of the World Bank, and Creador, a private equity fund, as well as financing from the Asian Development Bank, among others. **(PNA) BY ANNA LEAH GONZALES**

PAGCOR'S NET INCOME UP 23% IN Q1

MANILA – State-run Philippine Amusement and Gaming Corporation (PAGCOR) on Wednesday reported a PHP4.2-billion net income in the first quarter of the year, as revenues continued to grow while lower operating expenses declined.

In a statement, PAGCOR said the net income during the period was 23 percent higher than the PHP3.43 billion in the first quarter of 2024.

PAGCOR chairman and chief executive officer Alejandro Tengco attributed the strong performance to improved operational efficiency and strategic reforms within the agency.

"This solid performance reflects PAGCOR's commitment to responsible governance and fiscal discipline," he said.

the year, the budget deficit amounted to PHP478.8 billion, 75.62 percent higher than the same period last year, but still in line with the PHP1.5 trillion deficit program for 2025.

"The gains we have made in the first quarter will allow us to contribute even more to nation-building for the rest of the year."

Revenues jumped 11.2 percent to PHP28.07 billion from PHP25.24 billion a year ago.

The bulk of PAGCOR's revenues came from gaming operations, which contributed PHP25.52 billion.

More than half of gaming revenues came from the Electronic Games and E-Bingo segment which generated PHP14.32 billion, followed by licensed casinos at PHP8.32 billion. PAGCOR-operated casinos, meanwhile, contributed PHP2.88 billion.

Operating expenses fell by 15.54 percent to PHP6.21 billion from PHP7.36 billion in the same period last year.

Tengco said the state gaming agency will continue to innovate and strengthen regulatory oversight to ensure that its revenues directly benefit the Filipino people through its nation-building and corporate social responsibility programs.

SSS ENHANCES LOAN PROGRAMS FOR MEMBERS, PENSIONERS

MANILA – State-run Social Security System (SSS) said it will reduce interest rates for salary and calamity loans, expand the pension loan to include surviving spouse pensioners programs, and implement a micro-credit loan facility through third-party providers.

The enhanced benefits of members, which are part of the government's move to recognize Filipino workers, was announced by President Ferdinand R. Marcos Jr. in his Labor Day message at the SMX Convention Center in Pasay City on Thursday.

In a separate statement, SSS said the reduced interest rate shall be for members who have no availment of penalty condonation in the five years or those who have good credit quality.

The target implementation of the reduced interest rates for these loan programs is July 2025.

"As announced early this year, we proposed and obtained approval of the Social Security Commission, headed by our Chairperson Finance Secretary Ralph G. Recto, to reduce interest rates for salary loans and calamity loans. From the current interest rate of 10 percent, salary loan interest rate shall be reduced to 8 percent while calamity loan interest rate shall be reduced to 7 percent," SSS President and Chief Executive Officer Robert Joseph de Claro said.

SSS is also looking at expanding the Pension Loan Program to include surviving spouse pensioners.

Data from the agency showed that as of December 2024, there are 1.2 million surviving spouse pensioners who could benefit from the expanded Pension Loan Program which is targeted

to be implemented by September this year.

"We acknowledge the need of other pensioners for access to a dependable loan facility, so we are expanding the PLP to surviving spouse pensioners. The maximum loanable amount shall be PHP150,000," de Claro said.

The PLP for surviving spouse pensioners shall also be covered by Credit Life Insurance, with the insurance premium to be deducted from the proceeds of the Pension Loan (PL).

SSS said this will ensure that in the event of the death of the PL borrower before full payment and end of the loan term, the PL balance shall be fully paid.

The SSS has also begun discussions with partner financial institutions on the feasibility of implementing a micro-credit loan facility for members with a tenor between 15 to 90 days.

"Currently, we are bringing the idea of a micro credit loan facility among our partner financial institutions through meetings and brainstorming sessions, and see if we can address such short-term cash needs of our members. When we see a framework for this micro-credit program, we will implement as soon as possible," de Claro said.

"We offer these enhancements to all Filipino workers, here and overseas, for Labor Day – Araw ng mga Manggagawa. We remain committed to our push for service excellence with program enhancements and innovations," De Claro added.

De Claro said SSS is also looking at ways on how to help members through livelihood loans as part of the Marcos administration's bid to reduce poverty.

The SSS is also in talks with the Department of Information and Communications Technology on digitalization programs, with PhilHealth for better collaboration through data synchronization, and with several industries for targeted stakeholder engagements. **(PNA) BY ANNA LEAH GONZALES**

Jay-R Colonia of Zamboanga City delivered two gold medals (clean and jerk, and total) and a silver (snatch) in the Youth men's 49kg. category in his first international competition.

Alexsandra Ann Diaz, also from Zamboanga City, dominated the Youth women's 45kg snatch and total and was third in the clean and jerk.

Cebuano Althea Bacaro added one more gold medal for Team Philippines after topping the snatch in the Youth women's 40kg category. She got the silver medal in total and the bronze in the clean and jerk.
